

What is the WEF Nexus in Africa?

This analysis of the WEF nexus in Africa illustrates both strengths and weaknesses of the WEF Nexus Index. The composite indicator highlights where the need for development to support human well-being lies. However, it also illustrates that care must be taken in the interpretation of the index values.

Are African countries performing sub-optimally in the WEF Nexus index?

Generally, African countries are performing sub-optimally in the WEF Nexus Index, appearing from the 44th rank in the global list. These sub-optimal performances are a key entry point for identifying challenges and planning intervention strategies for the continent and its member states.

Which African countries have the highest electricity access deficits?

Central African Republic, South Sudan and Chad are the African countries with the highest proportional electricity access deficits; 95%, 93% and 94%, respectively, of the national population remains unserved in 2020.

Why do we need nexus planning?

Persistent challenges that complicate achieving the simultaneous security and sustainability of water, energy, and food resources are motivating a shift from traditional sectoral thinking towards integrated approaches to resource management, for example the nexus planning approach.
