

Are US and European Union involved in North Korean military assistance to Russia?

Both the U.S. and European Union this week introduced additional sanctions on individuals and entities they said are involved in North Korean military assistance to Russia. Ukraine's intelligence services released new information Tuesday about the conduct of North Korean troops now fighting alongside Russian forces in the Kursk region.

Why did North Korea blow up South Korea's roads?

South Korea in turn said it was ready to respond,and warned that if the safety of its citizens was threatened it would signal the "end of the North Korean regime." Then,on Tuesday,the North blew up sections of two roads that connected it to South Korea,making good on an earlier threat.
