What is compressed air energy storage?

Compressed air energy storage (CAES) is one of the many energy storage options that can store electric energy in the form of potential energy (compressed air) and can be deployed near central power plants or distribution centers. In response to demand, the stored energy can be discharged by expanding the stored air with a turboexpander generator.

Where can compressed air energy be stored?

The number of sites available for compressed air energy storage is higher compared to those of pumped hydro [1]. Porous rocks and cavern reservoirs are also ideal storage sites for CAES. Gas storage locations are capable of being used as sites for storage of compressed air.

What are the advantages of compressed air energy storage systems?

One of the main advantages of Compressed Air Energy Storage systems is that they can be integrated with renewable sources of energy, such as wind or solar power.

How efficient is adiabatic compressed air storage?

More than 70% efficiency (from literature) was also obtained when thermal energy storage was also integrated in adiabatic CAES systems. With the use of a radial compressor, an adiabatic compressed air storage system operating at a lower temperature was also investigated.

What is thermo-mechanical energy storage (CAES)?

In thermo-mechanical energy storage systems like compressed air energy storage (CAES), energy is stored as compressed air in a reservoir during off-peak periods, while it is used on demand during peak periods to generate power with a turbo-generator system.

What determinants determine the efficiency of compressed air energy storage systems?

Research has shown that isentropic efficiency for compressors as well as expanders are key determinants of the overall characteristics and efficiency of compressed air energy storage systems. Compressed air energy storage systems are subdivided into three categories: diabatic CAES systems, adiabatic CAES systems and isothermal CAES systems.

In adiabatic compressed air energy storage systems (Fig. 7.2), the heat of compression is stored in one or more separate storage facilities so that it can be reused to heat up the air when it is withdrawn from the storage. Because this dispenses with the addition of combustion gas, this can be considered a pure power-to-power storage system.

CAES systems are categorised into large-scale compressed air energy storage systems and small-scale CAES. The large-scale is capable of producing more than 100MW, while the small-scale only produce less than 10 kW [60].The small-scale produces energy between 10 kW - 100MW [61].Large-scale CAES systems are designed for grid applications during load shifting ...
